Exciting Times in 2009!

As Horse Haven of Tennessee (HHT) begins to start its tenth year, 2009 looks to be the most exciting, fulfilling and successful year ever!

Since 1999, HHT has grown to be Tennessee's oldest and largest equine humane society. We have continued to look for ways to be a positive influence in the fight against equine abuse and neglect in Tennessee. This year, HHT will be setting their sights higher, and working even harder to be a voice for the equine within our state. By striving to offer more educational programs, we hope to increase awareness across the state.

In January, the HHT Board of Directors held a 6 hour brainstorming retreat to put together

an exciting year of fundraising events, and educational programs for HHT to accomplish in the coming year.



As soon as the weather breaks HHT will be taking their educational program on the road. Starting with counties in East Tennessee, Horse Haven of Tennessee will begin their "Hoof Beats Across Tennessee Tour."

County by county, HHT representatives will meet with officials to explain HHT and what services we can provide for their county. Public meetings will be set up to allow the general public the chance to ask questions and voice their concerns regarding equine cruelty and neglect issues within their county.

Another program planned in 2009 is a discounted, euthanasia program. Responsible horse owners who could not normally afford this humane option when the need arises can apply for transportation and financial assistance. No horse should ever have to suffer because an owner can not afford to make a humane call.

A New Home for HHT in 2009

Even single digit temperatures couldn't keep HHT from getting settled into their new home.

48 hours after being served notice that our lease would not be renewed at the facility we had called home for the past three years, HHT was blessed with a facility that has the potential to offer our

equine numerous opportunities. More stall space, larger pastures, and work areas for one on one handling. HHT volunteers, working in bone chilling temperatures, came together to get the facility ready for the horses who arrived one cold Sunday afternoon. Now everyone is snug and cozy and enjoying their new surroundings and

routines.
